Join Central Illinois Foodbank in Largest Single-Day Food Drive to Help Stamp Out Hunger

High Rates of Food-Insecurity Call for Much Needed Community Support

Springfield IL., May 7, 2018– Central Illinois Foodbank is asking for Springfield’s support on May 12th as it joins America’s letter carriers in the 26th Annual National Association of Letter Carriers Stamp Out Hunger Food Drive. This food drive is the largest single-day food drive in the country. The event helps support local food banks and the one in eight Americans who struggle with hunger.

Springfield area residents can join Central Illinois Foodbank and support community members who struggle with hunger by simply collecting non-perishable food items and leaving them in a sturdy bag near their mailboxes on May 12th. A letter carrier will collect the donations and deliver them to Central Illinois Foodbank. Items will then be distributed to those facing hunger right here in central and southern Illinois.

In 2017, the Foodbank received 35,709 pounds of food from the one day collection. “Stamp Out Hunger is like no other food drive. It allows every community across the country to collectively come together on one day to do their part to fight hunger. We are so grateful to community members who donate non-perishable items and for the letter carriers who take the time to collect each bag to help fight hunger in central and southern Illinois,” said Central Illinois Foodbank Executive Director, Pam Molitoris.

According to Feeding America’s *Map the Meal Gap 2017* study, nearly 105,000 people in central and southern Illinois face food insecurity, including over 35,000 children. Stamp Out Hunger is the opportune time for the public to support neighbors who struggle with hunger.

The Stamp Out Hunger food drive was created in 1993 by the National Association of Letter Carriers to encourage communities to come together in an effort to stock the shelves of food banks and pantries nationwide. The event is held on the second Saturday of May each year. For 25 years, Central Illinois Foodbank and local letter carriers have worked together to contribute to the national food drive.
